FROM THE PASTOR...

The Lenten Journey... *finding lost treasures...*

Have you ever lost something that was important to you? You don't even know it's gone until you need it... or until you are reminded of it. And then, you can't get it out of your mind. You search high and low, underneath and inside, hoping to find it again. And all the while, the frustration grows: "Did I let someone borrow it?" "Did I put it someplace safe – where I wouldn't forget it?" "Did I get rid of it?" "What did I do with it?!"

It's easy to "lose" things... even things that are important to us. We may believe in the importance of forgiveness and reconciliation – but we let all those little things build up and become scars... thick walls that no longer allow forgiveness to break through. We may believe that family time (and/or personal time) is important – but before we know it, there is no time left in our days... and we are out of touch with members of our own family (and ourselves).

Over the years, I have come to truly appreciate the season of Lent. I appreciate this time of intentional reflection and renewal because it can be just the time we need to discover what it is that we have "lost" in our lives... to seek what has been misplaced or buried, ignored or tossed away, especially with regard to our faith life (those spiritual disciplines that serve to keep us centered and grounded in the One who gives us life)...

The scriptures are filled with stories of *lost treasures* being found – there is the shepherd who searches out the one sheep that is lost; and there is the woman who searches high and low to find the lost coin; and there is the lost son who returns home to his waiting father. And what about the parables of people selling all they have in order to get a treasure found hidden in the field... or a pearl of great worth. And think of all the people who came to Jesus seeking something lost: the blind sought sight... the paralyzed and the ill sought healing... the lepers sought cleansing and restoration to community... woman who washed Jesus' feet with her tears found a well of forgiveness. Jesus helped all these to "find" what had been lost.

Lent is a time to return to our Lord and to his cross... to see again how he "re-found" us through his death and resurrection... to come to know anew this One who continually comes to us and seeks us out and finds us – like the Good Shepherd. As we walk this journey of Lent, may you each find the *lost treasures* of your heart... and be renewed and re-centered in your walk of faith.

Pastor and Jene will explore different ways of printing the bulletin and cost. We want to make it easier to follow the order of service.

The anniversary topic will be taken to council for ownership.

Meetings will be at 10:30 the Thursday before council meetings.

FINANCE

Finance Committee met at 6:00 p.m. on February 15, 2010 at JAK offices. Members present were Dan Shoemaker, Mark Ruppel, Brenda Kupferschmidt, Bruce Jungerberg, Carol Wallin, John Westin, and Tom Hallgren.

Budget Performance (January 2010)

Offerings (above projected budget) \$ 5535.00

Expenses (below projected budget) \$ 5592.00

Amount ahead of budget \$11,127.00

- A \$10,000 donation to the Building Fund has been applied to the loan principal.
- John Westin asked if church insurance premiums are based on actual inventory value. The issue is that the premiums may be excessive based on inflated inventory valuation. When is the policy renewed? Mark Ruppel will pursue as a Properties issue.

- January performance against budget shows a surplus for one month. Discussed timing and potential recommendations for the council if surplus continues. Possible actions include: offset projected budget shortfall, increase budgets most deeply reduced for 2010, apply to \$20,000.00 construction loan. Agreement that it is too early in the year to act.
- Current cash position in checking account (\$47,183.00) is excessive. Carol to move \$20,000.00 to money market account.
- As of 1/3/10 the Curb and Gutter assessment balance is \$2308.78. City of Cumberland is charging interest on this amount which is due January 2011. Carol will contact Dennis Rockow to determine the rate of interest. It may be advantageous to pay off early. If so, the council will need to pass resolution to handle as an off budget item.
- Mark Ruppel was thanked for his service on the Finance Committee.

Finance Committee meetings will be held on the 3rd Monday of the month at 6:00 p.m. at the JAK offices.

Stewardship

This year the stewardship committee has chosen "Make It Simple" as our theme. We will have something monthly about stewardship of the body, the environment, as well as our time, talents and treasures. We are planning a "fair" with booths about all the different committees, organizations and projects in our church to go along with the Time and Talent sheets next fall. The year long program will be based on the survey everyone filled out last fall.
